It operates out of the Rochester Canoe Club (RCC) along the shores of Irondequoit Bay off of Lake Ontario. RCC is a volunteer and family based one design dinghy sailing and racing club established in 1881 with a long history of developing both pleasure and nationally competitive sailors. ***ROC City Sailing's mission with the joint support of RCC's facilities and equipment is to educate, promote and advance the sport of sailing for the Greater Rochester Community in a safe, fun and affordable environment.***

**Job Title:** RCS Junior Sailing Instructor

**Reports to:** RCS Program Director

**Job Purpose / Overview:** Assist in implementing the overall RCS sailing programs per listed roles and responsibilities below. Communicate to and take direction from the RCS Program Director and Senior Sailing Instructor.

**Salary:** \$minimum wage to \$15 per hour dependent on qualifications and experience

**Job Classification:** Non-Exempt (paid time and a half for hours >40 in a given week)

**Benefits:** Standard NYS employment benefits as applicable

**Work Location / Environment:** Rochester Canoe Club (2050 Bay Shore Boulevard, Rochester NY 14622), Irondequoit Bay, indoor and outdoor, onshore and offshore daily activities

**Work Days / Hours:** 4 weeks during June-July 2020, typical 40-hour week, 8am-5pm, M-F plus the potential for additional part-time hours during May through October.

**Essential Duties and Responsibilities:**

- support execution of sailing lesson plans for youth and adult students based on US Sailing guidelines
- implement RCS safety program and emergency procedures on and off the water
- support boat & equipment maintenance and repair
- insure proper use and care of equipment and facilities
- establish and maintain effective working relationships with RCS staff, students, and parents
- support Pre-season sailing program, facilities and equipment setup and post-season pack up
